Upper Salford Township

A special meeting of the Upper Salford Board of Supervisors was brought to order by Chairman O'Donnell at 9:40 a.m. Messrs. Poatsy and Hagey were in attendance, as was the Township Solicitor, Stephen P. Imms, Jr. Attending the meeting on behalf of the Pennsylvania Department of Environment Protection was Ragesh Patel, Dustin Armstrong and Gina Thomas. Tim Hennessey from Representative Bob Mensch's office was also present.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss alternate water supply options to the **Baghurst Alley** area. DEP is proposing the establishment of a public water system utilizing a well in the general area to service those properties where the existing wells are contaminated.

It was decided that Ms. Thomas should contact Mr. Imms after the Board's April 14<sup>th</sup> meeting to see if the township is amendable to assuming ownership of any public water supply system.

Mr. O'Donnell indicated his desire to make the public fully aware of the pending decision to rectify the water problem. Mr. Patel will be attending the Board of Supervisor's meeting on April 14<sup>th</sup> for further discussion. Announcements should be made to the public affected prior to that meeting.

Mr. Patel will notify the township if expenses incurred by the township would be reimbursable, should the township desire further site evaluations by the township's hydrogeologist.

No further action was taken.

The Board of Supervisors offered their consensus to include Lower Frederick in the application through the Green Field Green Town program for the **acquisition of the Spring Mountain House property.**

The Board of Supervisors directed the Township Solicitor to communicate to Edmund Mullin, attorney representing T. H. Properties in regard to the **Normandie Golf Course** Subdivision, that the Board is willing to accept a 30 day extension of the review period of the pending subdivision plan until April 30, 2009 with clear communication to Mr. Mullin of the Board's expectations. A copy of the letter should be sent to Kate Harper, Esquire.

Mr. O'Donnell asked Tim Hennessey if Representative Mensch's office would support a delay in the closing of the **Spring Mount Bridge** until after the 2009 Folk Festival, which is scheduled for August 13<sup>th</sup> through August 16<sup>th</sup>, since the closing is currently scheduled for the end of July. The approximate two week delay will allow for a more profitable festival which will benefit both the Upper Salford and Lower Frederick Fire Companies.

The meeting adjourned at 11:10 a.m.
